a. **South Westmont Business District Public Hearing**

Board to consider ordinances for the South Westmont Business District Tax Increment Financing District:

1. To fix the date, time and place for the public hearing.

Background Of Subject Matter	The Eligibility Report and the Redevelopment Plan & Program for the South Westmont Business District are completed. Teska Associates recommends moving forward with the process.
Additional Background	Staff requests the date of Thursday, December 13, 2012 for a public hearing at the Committee of the Whole meeting. In addition, law requires the Village to pass an ordinance creating a registry of interested parties maintained by Community Development.

b. **Neighbors Publication Agreement**

Board to consider an ordinance approving an agreement with Emerald Marketing, Inc. to provide for the publication of a bimonthly local news magazine.

Background Of Subject Matter	The Village Board as well as the Westmont Chamber of Commerce, CUSD 201, Maercker School District 60, Westmont Park District & Westmont Library have partnered to publish a bimonthly news & information publication for Westmont residents and businesses.

8. New Business

a. **Variance Request - 430 South Linden Avenue**

Board to consider an ordinance approving the following requests from Tiffany Tang for zoning code variances to allow for the existing driveway to be resurfaced and a new rear yard paver patio:

1. Lot coverage greater than the 35% maximum allowed.
2. A driveway to encroach in the side yard setback.
3. A reduction in the minimum required lot area for an existing non-conforming lot.

Background Of Subject Matter	The proposal exceeds maximum lot coverage in a R3 zoning district, encroaches into the side yard setback, & lot is under the minimum size requirements. In response to the Plan Commission, applicant proved staff with revised plans.
Additional Background	The Commission clarified that existing debris would be removed, the new patio would have permeable pavers, asked the applicant to research if connecting drainage to the front yard outlet would be viable, & confirmed that the retaining wall would remain.
Recommendation	The Planning & Zoning Commission recommended unanimous approval of the Zoning Code Variance Requests. The Chairman noted that the side yard setback is exceeded through out the neighborhood, and this would not create a new non-conformity.

b. **Downtown Development Grant - 143 South Cass Avenue**

Board to consider an ordinance approving a downtown development grant request from Bob Cynowa.

Background Of Subject Matter	On September 19, 2012 the Downtown Development Grant committee met to consider an application from Bob Cynowa for the vacant property that he owns at 143 S. Cass. Previously it has housed an adult daycare facility & a Montessori school.
Additional Background	The plans for the property are to remove all siding/stucco finishes to replace with cedar-look vinyl siding, replacement of several windows & doors. The value of qualifying work, visible from the public right of way, totals \$6,580 of the \$21,172 budget.
Recommendation	The Committee recommended a grant award in the amount of \$3,290, the maximum monetary award for exterior work.

c. **Massage Establishment License - Heavenly Feet - 151 West Ogden Avenue**

Board to consider an ordinance approving the following:

1. Increasing the number of massage establishment licenses within the village from eight to nine, to allow for the issuance of a massage establishment license to Heavenly Feet at 151 West Ogden Avenue.
2. Issuing a massage establishment license to Heavenly Feet at 151 West Ogden Avenue.

Background Of Subject Matter	The village has received and reviewed an application from Heavenly Feet to operate a massage establishment at 151 W Ogden Ave. A background investigation has been completed and a recommendation from the Chief of Police submitted to the board for review.
Additional Background	The board must consider increasing the number of massage establishment licenses from 8 to 9. If the number of available licenses is increased, the board must either approve or deny the issuance of a massage establishment license to Heavenly Feet.
Recommendation	Staff recommends review of the Chief of Police's recommendation and the information provided on whether to increase or decrease the number of massage licenses available within the village. (Village Ordinance Section 22-1415)

d. **Holy Trinity Church Oktoberfest 2012**

Board to consider an ordinance approving the following two requests from Holy Trinity Church for an Oktoberfest event from 11:00 a.m. to 10:30 p.m., on Saturday, October 20, 2012:

1. Closure of street parking spaces and sidewalk areas on East Richmond Street, west of Linden in front of Holy Trinity School.
2. Issuance of a license for amplified sound during the event.

Background Of Subject Matter	This is the first year for the Holy Trinity Oktoberfest event. The event is a fundraiser for the church/school and is open to the public. The event will consist of food and beverage sales including alcohol, kids activities, live music and a DJ, and more.
Additional	This event will be contained on Holy Trinity Church property. The

Background	committee hopes to draw in up to 1000 people over the course of the day.
